

**Bring a piece of
Rotary history
back to life**



One winter day, Rotary founder Paul Harris took a walk on a well-kept street just outside Chicago. He watched as local children sled down a hillside and thought of his own boyhood in New England. At that moment, he decided that if he were ever to own a home, it would be on top of that hill on Longwood Drive.

In 1912, Harris and his wife, Jean, made Paul's dream a reality with the purchase of a gracious Tudor-style home on that very street, which they named Comely Bank after the street in Scotland where Jean grew up.

For almost 40 years, they hosted Rotary meetings and entertained visiting dignitaries in the home. They planted trees, which still grow, in their friendship

garden and lovingly displayed items collected from around the globe. The world's early Rotarians met in the basement of the home and fostered the friendships upon which Rotary was built and thrives on today.



After Paul Harris passed away in 1947, Jean sold their home and returned to Scotland. The house changed hands twice more before Rotarians bought it for US\$550,000 in 2005 with plans to preserve it as a living monument to our founder.

Today, this piece of Rotary history is being restored to the way it looked in the 1940s and will serve

as a museum and gathering space for Rotarians and other visitors from throughout the world. Interactive exhibits will give visitors a peek into the personal lives of Paul and Jean Harris.

\$10,000 – You will receive name recognition outside the house or in the stairwells, a pin, a key to the home, and membership in the Paul Harris Home Society.

\$5,000 – Your name will be displayed on a video monitor in the house, and you will receive a pin, a key to the home, and membership in the Paul Harris Home Society.

\$1,000 – Your name will appear on a brick in the driveway or garden.

\$500 – You will receive a certificate and a commemorative medallion.

\$250 – You will receive a donor pin.
